

FROM THE PRESIDENT

As we head into the final months of the year, I find myself reflecting on all that we've accomplished together—and feeling deeply grateful for the community that makes our work possible. Every adoption, every event, every animal that finds safety and love again happens because of your support.

This winter, we're preparing for our most important fundraiser of the year—our holiday matching campaign, which provides the majority of the funds that keep our shelter running. The SPCA of Nelson County receives no county, state, or national funding—we rely entirely on the generosity of donors like you. The incredible generosity of our "matching" donors makes it possible for your donations to go twice as far! Our Holiday Matchers will double up to \$100,000 in total contributions received now through December, or postmarked by December 31, 2025. General donations, honoraria, and memorials all qualify.

Thanks to your continued support, 2025 has been a year of growth, progress, and happy tails. So far this year, **50 dogs and more than 120 cats** have found their loving homes—including some who had been with us for more than 500 days. We've **expanded our presence in the community,** attending nearly 50 local events—from festivals to health fairs—to spread awareness and connect with our community.

Behind the scenes, we've strengthened our volunteer and foster programs with new training, handbooks, and orientations, and we're thrilled to invite more people to get involved!

Our business partnerships have also grown, helping us build relationships that provide donations, sponsorships, and services that keep our shelter thriving.

We've made **important progress on the upkeep** of our 21-year-old Almost Home Pet
Adoption Center, including septic system
maintenance, updates to our cat areas, and
extensive grounds and yard work. While some
of the services associated with the projects are
donated, there are costs associated with
keeping our Adoption Center safe and
welcoming. In the coming year, we hope to
enclose our garage door, repair kennel fencing,

and create more usable indoor space for our animals. If you know (or are) a building contractor who would like to help us do this, please reach out!

As we look ahead, we're excited to continue expanding our spay/neuter programs, education initiatives, and community outreach. Together, we're building a stronger, more compassionate Nelson County—one where every adoptable animal has the chance for a safe and loving home.

From all of us at the SPCA of Nelson County, **thank you** for believing in our mission and helping us make such a difference this year. If you'd ever like to see our work firsthand, please reach out—we'd love to give you a tour and show you everything your support makes possible.


Their dedication to the animals in our care, and to our community, is clear when you walk into our shelter or see us at community events.

STAFF SPOTLIGHT

When Rose Fariss joined Almost Home in 2014, it wasn't just the start of a new job—it was the beginning of a calling. After stepping away from a management position in the convenience store industry, she was looking for a part-time role where she could make a difference. An initial interview with the Amherst Humane Society led, through a serendipitous recommendation, to Almost Home.

"I called every two days for three weeks," she laughs. "When I finally got the chance to visit, I was immediately struck by the need of the dogs. They needed care and love. Looking into those big doggie eyes, I knew I was exactly where I was meant to be."


In the ten years (11, come November!) since she first stepped into the kennels, Almost Home has undergone incredible transformation. "The shelter today is truly a team," she says proudly. "We have a supportive board, a dedicated staff, and volunteers who all work side-by-side for the animals."

Almost Home is now fully staffed, equipped with training manuals, handbooks, and standard operating procedures that ensure consistent, compassionate care.

Communication tools like Google Workspace have streamlined operations, while a beautiful new website makes connecting with adopters and supporters easier than ever.

The shelter has also expanded its community presence through partnerships with local businesses and organizations. Events with Devil's Backbone, Subaru, the Nelson County Sheriff's Department, and countless local restaurants and businesses have brought both adoptions and awareness. Programs like TNR (Trap-Neuter-Return) and the Community Food Program have flourished thanks to generous community partners—including Gleaning for the World, the Amazon Warehouse Pet Program, and local residents who volunteer their time and effort.

Rose sees the shelter's biggest success as the people: "Our team, from the board to the staff to volunteers, is our greatest achievement. We've built a professional, welcoming shelter that people want to visit, support, and adopt from."

For Rose, community shelters are essential. "We don't just care for homeless animals—we help owned pets, too," she says. "Whether it's food support, spay or neuter assistance, or education, shelters like ours keep families and pets together."

At the end of the day, it always comes back to the animals. "They're my heart," she says. "There's not a day that goes by I don't stop to snuggle a cat or play with a dog. And when things get stressful, I go back to my roots—I grab a scrub brush, clean a kennel, and find peace in knowing we're making a difference."

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT

Volunteers are the heartbeat of Almost Home Pet Adoption Center and the Nelson SPCA! Our incredible staff and board of directors count on them every day to keep the shelter thriving, care for our furry friends, raise vital funds, and spread the word about animal welfare across Nelson County.

Two of our incredible volunteers are Andi and her son Tad, who have been contributing their time and talents for several years. After retiring (twice!) from a career in Special Education, Andi sought a meaningful way to spend her time. When a very wise person suggested that Andi volunteer to walk dogs at the shelter, she embraced the idea wholeheartedly.

Andi's love for dogs runs deep. When she was younger, she frequently drew dogs and included them in her school projects, and even now, bringing joy to pups remains her main passion. She spends quality time with the dogs, giving them love, attention, and basic obedience training to help them shine as future

family members. She knows each dog's quirks and personality, making her a fantastic advocate when it's time to find them a new home.

Tad, who has special needs, shares Andi's affection for dogs. He also adores the people at Almost Home. He's a helping hand and a ray of sunshine—tackling chores, hauling supplies, and bringing joy. Tad offers warm hugs to everyone he meets. He uplifts both humans and animals alike at Almost Home.

Together, Andi and Tad participate in community events, taking dogs into public spaces to give them a break from shelter life and raise awareness about the Nelson SPCA. Andi's insight into each dog's personality helps match them with the perfect home.

We're beyond grateful to Andi and Tad for their dedication, warmth, and the joy they bring to Almost Home. Their compassion and time make a lasting impact on our animals and our people.
